

### A Message From Our Pastor:

"Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."

Last month, we heard how Jesus welcomed the children in his midst and encouraged us to do the same. I have to say, we do a good job welcoming kids into our worship here at Bethany. It's always a joy when any of the toddlers, infants, or children are present with us. Seeing faces light up as the kids assist in collecting the offering, greeting everyone on their way in or out of the sanctuary, or coming forward for a children's sermon. It's clear that we love and value the children in our midst.

I want to share with you all one way that some congregations are welcoming the children in the midst of worship. It's called a prayground, a space specifically dedicated for our youngest disciples to be a part of worship and engage with the Gospel in age-appropriate ways.





These spaces are filled with soft toys, crayons and coloring pages, and foam blocks. They are located in a space where the children have an unobstructed view of the altar, often at the front. In a pray ground, toddlers and preschoolers have the space to engage with worship at their level, learning about how we pray and sing and worship the same way they learn about the rest of the world around them: by playing.

As an article from Augsburg Fortress says, "What happens is that, during the words of institution, you'll see kids mimic the postures of the celebrant. You'll watch kids who used to build towers out of blocks every week pull their chairs up to the chancel with a hymnal in their hands. You'll get texts after dinner from young parents telling you that their toddler started singing the Kyrie in the bathtub, out of nowhere. When kids have a comfortable place to exist in the worship space, they can relax enough to allow the liturgy to sink in. It won't happen in only a few weeks, but if you commit to the Pray-Ground, I promise that it will happen."

I give thanks for the many ways children contribute to our worship and pray that we would continue to welcome children of all ages and abilities in our midst. May we welcome children and remember that Christ is present as well.


